4. New Business
 - a. CSF Fall 2024 Meeting Recap
 - i. CSF Standing Policies 2 & 6 Amendments
 - Standing Policy 2: Intercollegiate Athletics from Class 2: Inappropriate for *majority* SSF funding to Class 1: Inappropriate for *any* SSF funding
 - Standing Policy 6: At least 1 member of referendum committees is a student SFAC member or nominated by campus's SFAC
 - ii. CSF Opposition to NRST Increase
 - 9.9% increase to Non-Residential Student Tuition (NRST) passed at last Regents meeting
 - To match tuition cost at comparable institutions & \$270M upcoming shortfall
 - Grouped with 2025-2026 FY budget, did not consult CSF or other related student representatives, informed on short notice
 - iii. CSF Campaign 2024-2025 is focused on student fee transparency
 - At the moment, each UC campus publishes information about both the intended purpose and actual usage of SSFs and their campus-based fees
 - The purpose and usage are usually split between multiple websites/documents, so it can be difficult to understand without financial

- expertise
- CSF wants to propose a standard set of guidelines, making it easy for students to locate and fully understand the reports
- Each campus SFAC can help by reaching out to their administrators and spreading awareness among their student bodies
- b. CPEO 8 College Games
 - i. Collaboration between the colleges and the Campus Events team to host a tournament of friendly and inclusive games
 - ii. The Campus Events team creates and enforces the professional standard of the event while the Colleges help with design and logistics
 - iii. Emphasizes university-wide and cross-cultural teamwork and engagement, inclusivity and belongingness, and campus resource awareness
