Finalization of Areas for SFAC Investigation

- 1. Areas: Transportation, Student Life, Sustainability, Career Services, Food Pantry, International Students, Community, Fitness, Student Safety, Student Retention and Success
- 2. Transportation, technically outside of SFAC
 - a. Parking is an issue, but can SFAC be impactful in this area? Probably not, other resources/groups are already working on this
- 3. Student Life, determining what fits under that rubric
- 4. Food Pantry, impact is limited because it requires more funding and has deep seeded economic roots, other groups are already assisting the pantry to great depths
- 5. Student Safety, vague long-term initiatives
- 6. Transportation and the Food Pantry already have their own committees that are doing a lot of work in those areas already; rather, focus our energy on areas that don't have established committees
- 7. Student Life
 - a. ArtPower!, CSI, TCLI, general program awareness
 - b. International students, community, fitness
 - c. Splitting student life into categories, such as looking at smaller and larger scale programming
 - d. Administrative hierarchies may cause issues amongst different areas of investigation; be distinctive about which path we're taking (campus vs. student)
 - i. It would accomplish both units and programs, and also issues that are important to us at student life, informing future years of how the processes compare to each other
 - e. "Campus Life"
 - i. ADA
 - ii. Long-term safety (resource management and planning)
 - f. "Student Life"
 - i. ArtPower, CSI, TCLI, program awareness
 - ii. Recommendation for a certain flexibility rather than limiting ourselves; taking student life as a whole

8. International Center

- a. Not necessarily a problem of more funding; rather the struggles of international students and the instability that one may have from not being of this country
- b. Bringing awareness to systematic issues is more important than bringing more funding to the International Center
- c. We're devoting attention and resources on international students, but not hitting the issue of diversity
- d. Unsafe environment; for example, there may not be any funding in their PhD career (yet it's equally true for resident students)
 - i. Difficult for international students to get funding/aid compared to resident students
 - ii. Points of view that could shed light on this issue and bring awareness/make a difference

9. Sustainability

a. Issues with transportation/parking creating more parking spaces by clearing more land

10. Career services

- a. Historically, has been a topic of discussion in the committee
- b. May be a situation with "no one on the other line," because of the recent turnover in administration; may be better off making this a priority next quarter/year
- 11. Motion to strike Campus Life
 - a. Bigger focus
